Day- to Week-Long Border Immersion

Worship, eat, learn, and serve alongside your sisters and brothers from the churches and communities of Agua Prieta, Sonora and Douglas, Arizona. Reflect on borderland history during a border infrastructure tour.

Border-to-Border Delegation: Coffee, Migration, and Faith

Journey from the U.S./Mexico border to the coffee communities of the Mexico/Guatemala border to discover the connections between coffee, migration, and faith.
