## Gathering Programs at a Glance

The Gathering begins with dinner on Thursday, August 2 (5:30–7 PM) and concludes with the morning plenary session on Sunday, August 5 (8:30–10:30 AM). Programming and housing are all under one roof at the Galt House Hotel.

### **Related Programs**

### **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Training**

In conjunction with the Gathering, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) will offer training for Presbyterian Women to become disaster preparedness trainers. PW disaster preparedness trainers are expected to organize and conduct a minimum of three disaster preparedness trainings a year, sharing the basics of disaster preparedness with congregations in their presbyteries.

The training will be held on Wednesday, August 1, 2018, 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM and is open to all interested PW. PDA will pay for two nights of lodging; July 31 and August 1. All meals on August 1 will be provided. There will be no minimum nor maximum number for this training. Download the application and reference form from www.presbyterian women.org/gathering. PDA will have a hospitality room at the Gathering, where PW disaster preparedness trainers who are attending the Gathering can meet, discuss their experiences and get the latest news and help from PDA.

The triennial business meeting of Presbyterian Women will convene at 7 PM on Wednesday, August 1 and adjourn by 5 PM on Thursday, August 2. The schedule is arranged so that voting representatives can participate in all Gathering programming.

## Plenary Highlights

The presenters in the Gathering plenary sessions have important voices for women of faith to hear. Coming to us from different parts of the country and with a wealth of experience from which they speak, they will share their dynamic faith.

In this year of celebrating 30 years of Presbyterian Women, these presenters bring a richness to engaging our faith. Together we will imagine who PW is today: What does she look like? How does she live her faith (in transformative, world-changing ways)? Our speakers and our musicians—Allanda Small Campbell and Phillip Morgan—invite us to creatively consider the future of PW.

The theme of the Gathering comes from Isaiah 60:1, "Arise, shine, your light has come!" In each plenary session we will focus on a different element of the verse and work with themes that are important to PW.

### Thursday Evening, August 2

The opening plenary focuses on "Arise" and considers the topics of nurturing our faith—beginning in grace and waking up to the wholeness/fullness of the gospel, with justice and peace as central to our faith. Ruth Santana Grace, executive presbyter of the Presbytery of Philadelphia, will give the keynote address and Amy Poling Sutherlun, author of the upcoming PW/Horizons Bible study, will introduce the 2018–2019 Bible study God's Promise: I Am with You. The opening plenary is the first time we will be gathered together, so it is our "Welcome" moment, as well. Mary

Martin, Gathering chair; Rhashell Hunter, director of Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries; Susan Jackson Dowd, executive director of Presbyterian Women; and Louisville civic leaders will bring greetings.

### Friday Morning, August 3

Friday morning we will "Shine." Keynote speaker Katherine Blankenship, a minister of Word and Sacrament who is focusing her ministry on education and a vision for the future of church missions, will help us explore what it means to shine in our homes and in our communities, as people who live, work and do mission. Eugenia Gamble, author of the 2019–2020 PW/Horizons Bible study, Love Carved in Stone: A Fresh Look at the Ten Commandments, will review ideas that she presents in the study.

### Friday Evening, August 3

Marisol Jimenez believes that transformative practice comes through constant self-examination, compassionate conflict and visionary action by both individuals and communities. Marisol's keynote address will focus on "your light." As Presbyterian Women, we are called to work for justice and peace. What does such a life look like? How does the light of God's justice and peace illuminate the things we do and the choices we make? We will also hear from one of PW's Global Partners from Indonesia on the situation of women in her country.

### Saturday Morning, August 4

On Saturday morning, Lynn Miller, author of the 2020–2021 PW/Horizons Bible study, *To You They Cried: Reclaiming Lament*, will introduce the Gathering to her study. Yung

Me Morris, first-generation Korean American and pastor, has had to navigate between cultures all her life. Exploring the phrase, "Your light has come," Yung Me will consider the topic of building an inclusive and caring community, and how we live into the prayer we pray almost every time we worship: "Thy Kingdom come, . . . on earth as it is in heaven."

### Saturday Evening, August 4

We can't celebrate PW's 30th anniversary without a party! A banquet, decorations, games and fun—it's a celebration of our first 30 years as Presbyterian Women! This will be a communion service and a benediction from the entire Gathering, a sending forth that witnesses to the promise of God's kingdom. The Gathering choir will sing PW into its next 30 years.

### 2016 USA Mission Experience to the San Francisco Bay Area—Cecilia Moran and other participants

Offered once: Friday, 10:30 AM

Hear participants tell about the 2016 USA Mission Experience (USAME) to the San Francisco Bay Area, reflecting on what they experienced and how it changed their lives. You'll also learn how you can apply to participate in the next USAME.

### 2. 2017 Global Exchange to Indonesia— Peggy Free and other participants

Offered once: Saturday, 10:30 AM

Indonesia, the largest nation comprised solely of islands, is home to a number of faith traditions. Hear about the relationships between people of different faiths in Indonesia and relationships between U.S. and Indonesian women forged through the Global Exchange. Global partners from this region will be in attendance.

## 3. 21st-century Mission—Katherine Blankenship

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and 1:45 PM
The church has moved into the 21st century, but has our theology of mission caught up? This workshop will touch on our history of mission and some ideas of what the future has in store.

Katherine Blankenship is a minister of Word and Sacrament in the PC(USA). She received her MDiv and Master of Arts degree in practical theology from Columbia Theological Seminary.

## 4. Addressing Human Trafficking: From a Pastor in Michigan to a Mission Co-worker in Manila—Cathy Chang

Offered twice: Saturday, 1:45 and 3:30 PM

Come and listen to Cathy reflect on her journey from serving as a pastor to her current work as an international mission co-worker. Laugh and cry through highlights and lowlights from her family's first years of mission service. Reflect together about how this journey might inform your awareness and advocacy around human trafficking and migration.

Based in Manila, Philippines, Cathy Chang serves as the PC(USA)'s regional facilitator for addressing migration and human trafficking. She blogs at eveniftheskyfalls.wordpress.com.

### 5. Afila tus herramientas—Magdalena I. García

### 6. Beyond Diversity—Marisol Jimenez

Offered twice: Friday, 3:30 PM and Saturday, 10:30 AM

Develop language and frameworks for advancing equity within your organizations and communities. Together, attendees will look at how history, culture, policies and resource distribution uphold a structure of power, privilege and oppression that can only be interrupted by strategies that move beyond diversity.

Marisol Jimenez owns Teyepac Consulting, which offers racial equity trainings and coaching with community leaders and organizations across the country.

## 7. Beyond *Should*: Cultivating Prayer and Selfcare in Our Busy Lives—Brenda Bertrand

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and Saturday, 10:30 AM

You know you should pray more, but it seems impossible to fit it in. This session offers simple, ancient prayer practices that can be in support

of—not in opposition to—our already busy lives. The presenter will share her experience of monasteries, abbeys and convents across the globe and what she has learned about prayer, God and herself along the way. With these insights, participants will unearth their own faith stories and reclaim the joy of simple prayer—free of judgment or *shoulds*.

Brenda Bertrand finds joy in helping women take a leap of faith in work and life. A native of the U.S. Virgin Islands, she is a lifelong pilgrim, ordained minister and life coach.

## 8. Book Discussion of Jodi Picoult's *Small Great Things*—Jeanne Simpson

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and 1:45 PM

This discussion of Jodi Picoult's novel *Small Great Things* will look at race, privilege, prejudice, justice and compassion in a compelling story about an African American labor and delivery nurse who is told she is not allowed to touch the baby of white supremacists.

Jeanne Simpson is the pastor of senior adult ministries at Eastminster Presbyterian in Stone Mountain, Georgia. She has served in many leadership roles, including as both the PW moderator for the Synod of South Atlantic and the Presbytery of Greater Atlanta.

### 9. Clergywomen's Listening Session—Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries

Offered twice: Saturday, 10:30 AM and 3:30 PM What is your primary joy in ministry? What is something in your ministry that is different from what you expected it would be? How can the PC(USA) better support women in ministry? Join us for a time of connecting, sharing, peer support, listening and inspiring one another. Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries engages the church in its mission to become more diverse and inclusive of racial, ethnic, cultural and language groups, and equips women for leadership in all ministries of the church.

# 10. Creating Spaces: Exploring Young Women's Involvement in an Intergenerational Era—Alexis Presseau Maloof and Minna Pritchard

Offered twice: Friday, 3:30 PM and Saturday, 3:30 PM

This roundtable discussion introduces young women to the opportunities available within the ministries of Presbyterian Women and the PC(USA), while also creating an open dialogue on program ideas that serve young women. Moderated by the Young Women's Representatives of the Churchwide Coordinating Team (CCT), this roundtable welcomes all perspectives.

Alexis Presseau Maloof is a Young Women's Representative at Large. She lives in Peoria, Illinois, and is a teacher, writer and mother. Minna Pritchard is a representative from Young Women in Leadership, Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries, on the CCT. She is a writer and librarian, living in Atlanta.

## 11. Creator-created Creativity—Amy Kim Kyremes-Parks

Offered twice: Saturday, 10:30 AM and 3:30 PM Join us for some time to quiet the inner critic. Enjoy creating projects (in a criticism-free space) that you can use in your daily life to connect to our Creator. We will be using creativity to meditate.

Amy Kim Kyremes-Parks serves as the director of spiritual formation at Fairmount Presbyterian Church in Cleveland Heights, Ohio.

## 12. Disrupting Racism: Next Steps—Anita Coleman

Offered twice: Saturday, 1:45 and 3:30 PM
This experience-based workshop will help participants gain a deeper understanding of the systems of power and privilege that perpetuate racism. It will equip participants to initiate conversations around antiracism in their own congregations and communities. Participants will spend time examining their own experiences related to diversity, power, and privilege and will learn about language, tools and resources for disrupting racism.

Anita Coleman, founder of the Anti-racism Digital Library, teaches about human categorization, diversity, identity and discipleship. She currently serves on PW's CCT and as vice president of the Presbyterian Writers Guild.

Teresa Waggener is manager in the PC(USA)'s Office of Immigration Issues. Amanda Craft is manager of advocacy in the Office of Immigration Issues.

Learn about the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) studies and what this research suggests as a possible starting point on moving past trauma.

Lucy Apatiki is an Alaska Native woman who has a passion to see the honor and true identity of her people restored. She advances this goal by raising awareness of intergenerational historical trauma.

## 25. A Learning and Sharing Experience with Mission Partners—Hosted by Pam Snyder

Offered once: Saturday, 3:30 PM

Our Mission Partners—women from other countries and cultures—will share their faith journeys. Participants will spend time together talking about how Christian religious life is viewed in our Mission Partners' homelands and native cultures. The partners will talk about their own mission work and how their mission work connects with PW mission worldwide.

Pam Snyder served as vice moderator for mission relationships on PW's 2012–2015 CCT and has participated in two Global Exchanges and numerous mission opportunities in other countries.

## 26. Lessons in Laughter, Owed to Mom— Tom Willadsen

Offered twice: Friday, 1:45 and 3:30 PM

Come learn how laughter works and how it can be a tool for bringing people together and offering perspective in trying times. The presenter was mentored by a true master practitioner of laughter—his mother, who still lives in that great punchline of a town: Peoria, Illinois. (Love you, Mom! Love you, Peoria!)

Tom Willadsen has been a Presbyterian minister for more than 25 years, serving in Minnesota, Maryland and Wisconsin. Tom is the author of OMG! LOL! Faith and Laughter, published by Gemma Open Door in 2012.

### 27. Let's Be Bold: Presbyterian Women Making a Difference—Carol Winkler and Susan Jackson Dowd

Yung Me Morris is a first-generation Korean American Presbyterian pastor who is more comfortable ministering out of the box than within it. She calls herself an emotional Presbyterian and has no plans to stifle herself.

### 31. Preventing and Responding to Violence Against Women and Children in Africa— Debbie Braaksma

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and 1:45 PM Come and hear about the courageous, effective work that Presbyterian World Mission partners and mission personnel are engaged in to address violence against women and children in Africa. You will learn about the hands-on, educational and advocacy strategies that are being used to address the immediate needs of survivors, as well as the root causes of the violence. Opportunities for personal engagement by PW will be shared.

As the Africa area coordinator for Presbyterian World Mission, Debbie Braaksma is responsible for facilitating and resourcing the PC(USA)'s work with 34 African partners and 40 mission personnel. She has worked in the areas of peacebuilding, trauma healing, evangelism and community development.

## 32. Reimagining Leadership: Racial Ethnic Leadership Development and Networking—Jieun Kim Han

Offered once: Saturday, 3:30 PM

This session highlights racial ethnic and women's leadership development opportunities in the church. We will reflect on the many gifts and styles of leaders (including yours!), explore how leadership development benefits the whole church, and discuss how effective networking sometimes may take you beyond your comfort zone.

Jieun Kim Han serves as the associate for racial ethnic leadership development and recruitment in Racial Ethnic & Women's Ministries.

### 35. Sharing the Story of Gun Violence— David Barnhart

Offered twice: Friday, 1:45 and 3:30 PM
Following a screening of the updated documentary, *Trigger: The Ripple Effect of Gun Violence*, participants will discuss how stories can be used to engage our own congregations and communities in reflection, dialogue and collective action around the issues of gun violence. In the current climate of increased polarization and divisiveness, how can we, as people of faith, take steps together in our own communities to find common ground and prevent gun violence?

David Barnhart is an award-winning producer, director and filmmaker who is committed to story as a means to connect and engage. With his wife, Elise, he is the proud and tired parent of twins.

## 36. Shining Light Through Creativity and Community—Lisle Gwynn Garrity

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and 3:30 PM
Come explore rest, connection and light through the messy and beautiful creative process. In this hands-on workshop, participants will push beyond fear and self-doubt to create art in community. Through a communal painting exercise, participants will offer creative visual expressions based on scripture. All are welcome, especially those who claim to have no artistic abilities.

Lisle Gwynn Garrity is an artist, retreat leader and ordained minister in the PC(USA). She is the founder and creative director of A Sanctified Art, LLC, a collaborative arts ministry that provides multimedia resources for churches.

#### 37. Social Media for Churches—Mari Graham

This workshop will provide an overview of the major social media channels and best practices for the various channels. The discussion-based workshop will teach you how to communicate effectively via social media.

Together, we'll lament losses, celebrate gifts, let go of what kills our joy, recognize God's enduring presence and reimagine meaning in the single life we perhaps didn't expect. This experiential session offers a safe space for deep soul work. Tears, anger and laughter allowed!

Brenda Bertrand finds joy in helping women take a leap of faith in work and life. A native of the U.S. Virgin Islands, she is a lifelong pilgrim, ordained minister and life coach.

## 39. Temptations and Transformation at "The Table"—Ruth Faith Santana-Grace

Offered twice: Friday, 10:30 AM and 1:45 PM
There are few more revealing symbols in our culture than that of the table. At the many tables we encounter—physical and metaphorical ones—some people are "in," while others are "out." Whether a dining hall table or boardroom table, tables suggest a socially accepted "order" with often mistaken perceptions about who we are or others believe us to be. But, as a people of faith, we all are invited to Jesus' table. By engaging the biblical narrative, we will reflect on the temptations that get in the way of welcoming all people. This will be an opportunity to reaffirm our identity as a people of faith called to be a transformative presence in the world.

## 41. You're a PW Treasurer. Now What?—Ana Camila Vazquez and Rhonda Martin

Learn more about what it means to serve as a treasurer for Presbyterian Women. This session will also be an opportunity to explore the free but invaluable *PW Manual: A Guide for PW Treasurers*.

#### **Tours**

Mission tours require a \$25 payment, which covers transportation and a donation to the missions. The \$25 per tour must be prepaid with Gathering registration.

Presbyterian Center tours are free, but participants are responsible for getting themselves the short distance from the Galt House to the Presbyterian Center.

### A. Louisville Mission Tour Offered once: Thursday, August 2, 1–5 PM

Visit Hope Community Garden and Kentucky Refugee Ministries. To establish Hope Community

Garden, 35 resettled refugee and new American families in the Beechmont neighborhood received garden plots, as well as environmental education and agricultural training. Ten of the garden members formed a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) program, which weekly distributes produce to 25 subscribers. In addition to establishing food security and income generation, this ministry has increased community dialog about food security and urban agriculture. Kentucky Refugee Ministries advocates for and provides resettlement services to refugees. From job placement to citizenship classes, KRM programs support individuals in their journey to rebuild their lives with a sense of hope and belonging.

### B. Southern Indiana Mission Offered once: Friday, August 3, 1-5 PM

Learn about two Southern Indiana mission projects—the D.I.A.P.E.R. Project and Center for Lay Ministries. The acronym D.I.A.P.E.R. stands for Diapering Infants and Providing Emergency Resources. This Charlestown, Indiana, project provides diapers, nutritious food and first-aid supplies to families who are struggling financially and have infants and small children. A recipient of the Thank Offering, the project works toward ensuring that all babies remain clean, dry and healthy. Center for Lay Ministries provides services to vulnerable populations in the local community. In addition to operating a 12-bed facility for women who are addicted to drugs or alcohol, this organization runs a food pantry and teaches classes to promote self-sufficiency and healthy living.

# C. Presbyterian Center Tours Offered six times: Thursday, August 2, 2 PM, 3 PM and 4 PM and Friday, August 3, 11 AM, 2 PM and 4 PM

#### **Exercise Classes**

These exercises are low-impact. Tai chi and qigong increase and smooth the flow of energy throughout the body. The combination of the two helps with deep breathing, balance and memory and can calm the mind and relieve stress. Her classes are appropriate for all ages and levels of experience. Wear clothing in which you can move freely, and flat-heeled, comfortable shoes. The classes will be held Friday, August 3; Saturday, August 4; and Sunday, August 5; 6:45–7:30 AM each morning.

   The approximate cost for these services from the airport to the Galt House is \$13 for up to four people.

## Housing

All sleeping rooms for the 2018 Gathering will be at the Galt House Hotel, the site of the Gathering. Attendees are responsible for making their own hotel reservation and finding roommate(s). Only one person per hotel room should submit an online hotel reservation or call for the reservation, but should provide the names of others who will occupy that room. Each Gathering attendee staying at the Galt House will receive three \$5 vouchers for food and beverages (excluding alcohol) purchased in the Galt House.

The Galt House Hotel has two towers—Rivue Tower and Suite Tower—with a number of sleeping room options. Nightly room rates are outlined below, with one to four persons per room, plus taxes and fees in effect at the time of the Gathering. Currently, room taxes and fees total 16.07%. Please note that these taxes and fees may change without notice.
