#### **Vouchers**

Overnight guests at the Galt House will receive three \$5 vouchers, good toward the purchase of food and non-alcoholic beverages at the Galt House. These vouchers are included with your Gathering registration materials. The vouchers have no cash value. Tips should be given in cash. The vouchers cannot be replaced if lost.

### **Cents-Ability**

Sharing in Jesus' name is the reason Presbyterian Women support the Presbyterian Hunger Program and Cents-Ability. At each meal during the Gathering, look for Cents-Ability banks on dining tables. Deposit your spare change as thanksgiving for what you have, and offer a prayer for those who are in need.

Cents-Ability originated in 1976 as "Two-Cents-A-Meal"—a project begun by Rosellyn Calvert of First Presbyterian Church in Titusville, Florida—to involve individuals and families in a corporate response to world hunger. Over the years, presbyteries have developed similar programs. Many benefit local hunger ministries as well as the national and international projects of the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP).

### Ticket Exchange

Media representatives are welcome at the Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women. A press kit will be provided to all media representatives who register.

Each media representative will register as such, including the name of the media outlet for which she/he is acting as a media representative. A media representative may not actively participate in any portion of the Gathering unless she/he is invited to do so by those responsible for Gathering activities. Each media representative will wear a black ribbon identifying her- or himself as press during all portions of the Gathering. Presbyterian Women will provide an identification tag for each camera or video camera, at the time of the media representative's registration.

Upon request, the Gathering chair will be available to help facilitate interviews with plenary speakers, workshop leaders and Global Partners. Speakers and leaders reserve the right not to comment to media representatives. Health and/or security reasons may prevent some speakers and/or leaders from participating in follow-up interviews.

All plenary sessions are open to media coverage. Because they may be disruptive to speakers and participants, cameras with flash should not be used during plenary sessions. Plenary sessions are worship experiences. Areas where photographers may stand will be clearly designated. Photographers may not stand between participants and speakers or presenters.

All non-plenary sessions also are open. Media representatives are asked to identify themselves as such at the beginning of non-plenary sessions.
