Magdalene Ross came to the Presbyterian Hospital Bepanda Douala with a breach twin pregnancy. She gave birth to a boy weighing 4.2 pounds and a girl weighing 4 pounds. She had no baby clothes or supplies, so nurses provided warm clothes and hospital linens for the pre-term babies.

Magdalene and her two babies spent nearly two months in the hospital for postpartum care and nursing. This story is not unique to Magdalene. Pregnant women in rural Cameroon often go their entire pregnancy without seeing a doctor and pre-term deliveries are common.
