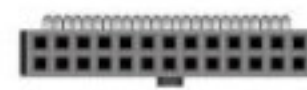

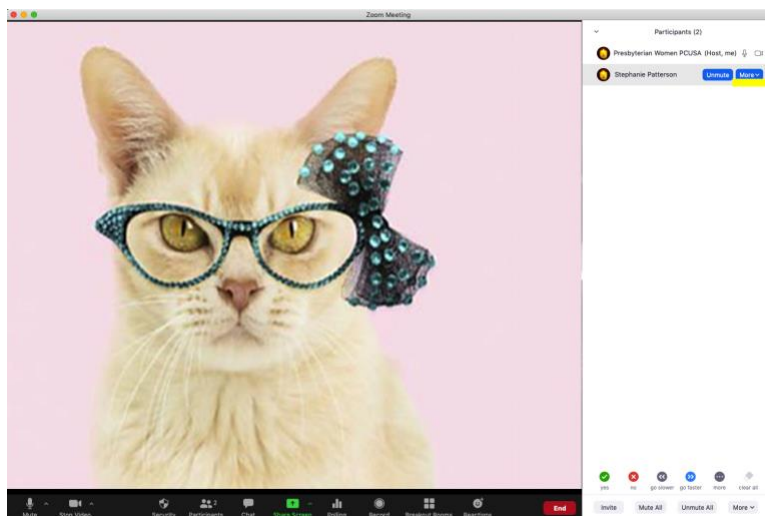
How to share a video (DVD or other media) in Zoom

Zoom allows the meeting host to share their screen or to give participants the ability to share their screens. If someone other than the Zoom meeting host will share the video, the host must allow screen sharing for that participant.

To do this, the host clicks on "participants" on the bottom navigation bar.



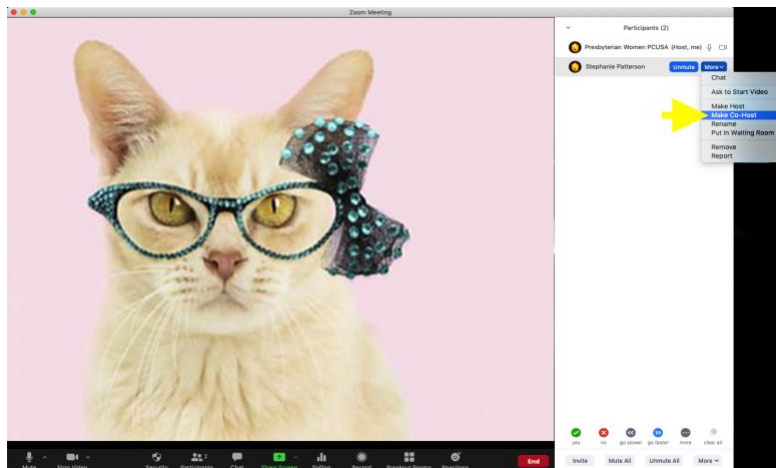
From the pop-up window that appears, the host hovers over the name of the participant who is to receive access and clicks "more" to the right of their name.

The host then clicks on "make co-host".

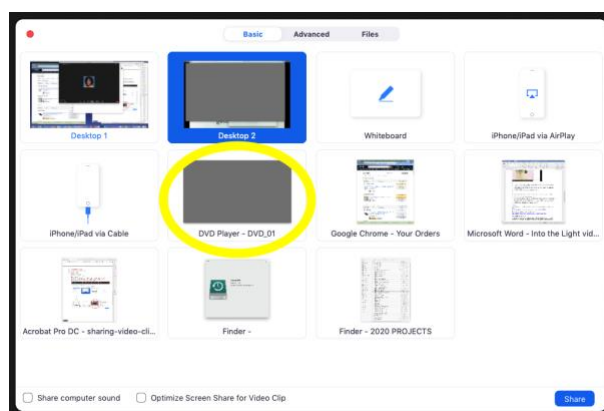


- Using your preferred video playing software (QuickTime, Real Player, etc.), queue up the video you wish to share on your device.
- In Zoom, after you have signed in and joined the meeting, click “share screen” (black row beneath the video).
- In the popup window that appears, select your video and, at the bottom left of the popup window, ensure you also select “share computer sound.”*
- Click the “share” button in the lower right.
- You will see the video on screen**, with a small banner at the top that says “You are screen sharing” on a green bar and “Stop Share” in a red banner. Using the controls in your video playing software, press play on the video to start, pause or restart the video, as needed.
- In Zoom, press “Stop Share” when the video is over.

NOTE:

*If you omit the “share computer audio” step, you’ll hear the video but your attendees will not.

**If the screen where the video should display turns gray after sharing your screen, press the ESC key on the keyboard after pressing play. If the gray screen continues to display, try using an open-source media player such as [VLC media player](https://www.videolan.org/vlc/index.html) (<https://www.videolan.org/vlc/index.html>).

Troubleshooting

Participants hear no sound when media is played in Zoom.

If the one sharing their media does not click “share computer sound,” they will hear the video, but the meeting attendees will not. Please visit the Zoom Help Center for additional helps: <https://support.zoom.us/hc/en-us/articles/201362153-Sharing-your-screen>.

Screen turns gray when sharing a DVD on Zoom.

(NOTE: be sure to get permission to share a commercial DVD video stream)

If the screen where the video should display turns gray after sharing your screen, press the ESC key on the keyboard after pressing play. If the gray screen continues to display, try using an open-source media player such as VLC media player (<https://www.videolan.org/vlc/index.html>).

Video recording

1. Choose a quiet location free from distraction.
2. Be sure to use good lighting.
3. Choose a small room for recording.
4. Sit about 2-3 feet from your device and PLEASE make sure your device is at eye level.
5. Try to look directly into the camera when recording.
6. Record in horizontal whenever possible, even when recording on a smartphone.
7. Relax!
