Scripture: Matthew 1

As you read the genealogy of Jesus outlined in Matthew 1, you may feel led to seek out or write out your own family genealogy. What I see in this genealogy is a call not only to write out my lineage, but also to list and consider the qualities and characteristics these family members possessed. Matthew 1 does not go into detail about each person's character, so Zerah, Hezron, Aminadab and others in Jesus' lineage come to us in relative anonymity. You may be drawn to investigate whom each of the named individuals are. How would you introduce these members of your family? Name alone does not tell the story of their whole identity or how they influenced Jesus and Jesus' family tree.

When I think about my own genealogy I am inclined to think about how I introduce myself to other people. My middle name is the combination of my paternal and maternal grandmothers.
