## Meditation

Autumn. On the first day as I wake to total darkness, I am reminded of a children's story.

At the beginning of fall, a little boy daily complained to his father about how he missed the sun in the morning and how he missed playing outside in the evening because of the darkness. After several days of whining, the boy said, "If I had one wish, I'd wish that it would always be spring and summer."

Hearing this, the father explained that the seasons were a result of Earth's rotation. Then, looking at his son, he asked, "Would you really want to keep the sun, knowing that children on the other side of the world would always have autumn and winter?"

When his son said no, the father smiled. Then the father said, "Think of the seasons as God's way of sharing the gift of the sun."



Remembering this story, I smile. My focus is no longer on the morning's darkness but on sharing—and God's love. God shared. God gave Jesus to the world—people in need of salvation—as an example of how to live. God sent a savior to help us, teach us, redeem us.

Hebrews 13:16 reminds us that Christian living is not solely about worshiping and praising God; it's also about doing good. It's about sharing one's time, talents, treasures and heart to help those in need. The phrase "love one another" appears 11 times in the Bible. More than 100 verses use phrases such as, "pray for one another," "encourage one another," "help one another" and "support one another."

Countless members of the family of God—those who are lonely, orphaned, sick, disempowered, marginalized, oppressed, homeless—are hurting. The world has so many needs, but we don't have to be overwhelmed by them all. Our job is not to save the world; God has already done this through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Our job is to continue Christ's ministry in the world. Today's scripture is a call to action. Each of us can do something to enrich the life of someone in need. Each of us can be a light, leading someone to the saving love of Christ. By serving others through small acts of kindness, dedicating time to doing good, giving to ministries such as Presbyterian Women, we serve God.
