Presbyterian Women, Inc. Board Meeting—In Person Once Again!



The 2021-2024 Presbyterian Women, Inc. Board of Directors met in Louisville, KY. This is the first in-person Board meeting since February 2020.

Presbyterian Women, Inc.'s, Board held their first in-person meeting of the triennium on September 22–24, 2022, in Louisville. The new conference center in the PC(USA) national office proved ideal for hospitality and community building. Fortuitously, the Committee on the Office of the General Assembly (COGA) also held meetings in the conference center, and two denominational leaders with deep respect for Presbyterian Women dropped in to bring greetings. Stated Clerk of the General Assembly J. Herbert Nelson II and General Assembly Co-moderator Ruth Santana-Grace offered thanks and encouragement to Presbyterian Women's Board.

The Board re-elected officers for the corporation. Susan E. Jackson-Dowd will continue as president; Rhonda G. Martin will again serve as vice president and treasurer and April L. Davenport, vice president and secretary. Michael K. Kirk was elected assistant secretary. The Board also elected Victoria Alexander and Sarah Rucker to serve as young women representatives.

Decisions regarding the Gathering logo and budget were also finalized. Included with this newsletter is a 2024 CWG flier with the logo to share, save and post! Or visit presbyterianwomen.org/ gathering. Watch *Horizons*, as well as PW eblasts for more details on the Gathering.

In addition to reviewing financial statements for Presbyterian Women Churchwide and the budget, the Board voted to raise mileage reimbursement (for the first time since 2015) to \$0.40 per mile. The Board affirmed a resolution from the Justice and Peace committee to financially support a webinar being led by Dr. Melanie Harris (author of *Ecowomanism: African American Women and Earth Honoring Faiths*). The webinar will be produced jointly through the Presbyterian Hunger Program (PHP), the Advocacy Committee on Women and Gender Justice (ACWGJ) and PW.

Rebecca Todd Peters, Presbyterian pastor and author of *Trust Women: A Progressive Christian Argument for Reproductive Justice*, joined the meeting via video. She detailed how abortion access is an aspect of reproductive justice and offered findings of surveys about who has abortions and why, as well as statistics on the attitudes regarding abortion in various faith traditions.

The Inclusive Community Committee

agreed on a number of ways to strengthen PW at all levels of the church. In January– March 2023, leaders from presbyteries and

Affirming the Right to Reproductive Justice

As a faith-based women's organization committed to work for justice and peace, Presbyterian Women, Inc., stands for gender equity and the right to reproductive justice and against the U.S. Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade, the historic Supreme Court ruling that provides a constitutional right to choose to terminate a pregnancy. This right ensures human agency and gender equity. In reversing Roe v. Wade, the U.S. Supreme Court's decision grossly undermines gender equity and leads to a complex system of injustices that critically impacts people across the country, with an undue burden falling on low-income, marginalized and vulnerable communities.

In 1992, the 204th PC(USA) General Assembly said, "the Christian community must be concerned about and address the circumstances that bring a woman to consider abortion as the best available option. Poverty, unjust societal realities, sexism, racism, and inadequate supportive relationships may render a woman virtually powerless to choose freely" (Minutes, pp. 367– 368, 372–374).

The 204th General Assembly also affirmed "the strong Christian presumption is that since all life is precious to God, we are to preserve and protect it," and said, "the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) encourages an atmosphere of open debate and mutual respect for a variety of opinions concerning the issues related to problem pregnancies and abortion." The GA provided guidance on circumstances that lead to prayerful decisions to terminate pregnancy (Minutes, Journal, pp. 367–368, 372–374). Presbyterian Women is committed to building inclusive community for all women, respecting the wide range of beliefs surrounding these issues.

Relying on foundations of Christian belief, the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) provides clear guidance regarding personal agency and choice. "God alone is Lord of the conscience." All humans are endowed with moral agency to make choices. We believe "the artificial or induced termination of a pregnancy is a

PW Delegation Forming for Commission on the Status of Women

Have you ever considered joining Presbyterian Women Inc.'s delegation to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW)? The 67th CSW will be held March 6–17, 2023, and offers an opportunity to learn about and advocate for justice for women throughout the world, and to find ways to apply insights to local, state and national levels. Presbyterian Women's participation will be online, with potential for an in-person group. The application form includes a field for indicating interest in joining an in-person delegation (should one form).

Each CSW focuses on a specific priority theme and a review theme. The focus of the 67th session of the Commission is "Innovation and technological change, and education in the digital age for achieving gender equality and the empowerment of all women and girls." The review theme is "Challenge and opportunities in achieving gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls."

Individuals applying must have a knowledge of and experience with the issues addressed by the 66th session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women. In addition, efforts will be made to select a delegation that reflects the diversity of Presbyterian Women including age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation or gender identity, ordination status and geographical distribution.

Application to join PW's Commission on the Status of Women delegation

Presbyterian Women Inc.'s delegation to the United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) will be part of a global witness for gender justice. Find out how you can apply to participate in the 67th CSW, to be held online, March 6–17, 2023.

PW and PC(USA) Renew Covenant

Presbyterian Women and the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) have had a longstanding partnership based upon shared beliefs, complementary visions and commitments, common history and a relationship of mutual respect and cooperation. An Institutional Relationship Agreement outlines PW's and the PC(USA)'s partnership in mission. Originally called a covenant, the agreement was first established in 2001 and renews every four years. The 225th General Assembly (2022) renewed the covenant (which was brought by the Presbyterian Mission Agency through the Racial Equity & Women's Intercultural Ministries area) as part of their consent agenda on July 5.

Of PW's relationship with the church, Denise Anderson, acting director for Racial Equity & Women's Intercultural Ministries, said, "In a time when so many of our rights as women and minoritized genders are under attack and even as PW over the years has been at the forefront of the justice efforts that the church has undertaken, I look forward to further partnership with PW on some of the most pressing matters facing women in the church and society."

While this covenant is specifically for the relationship between PW and the General Assembly, it is commended as a model for Presbyterian Women in relation to other corresponding councils. Honoring Three Women of Faith

Since 1986, the office of Racial Equity & Women's Intercultural Ministries, along with Presbyterian Women, has awarded church and community leaders with the Women of Faith Award. For 2022, nominations were requested for individuals who exemplify "Women Leading Movements for Positive Change."

From a pool of many nominations, three individuals were recognized with a Women of Faith award—Lauren Jacobs, abby mohaupt and Tamara Williams.

Lauren Jacobs was nominated for her work as the co-founder of Treasured Inheritance Ministry, an organization that focuses on theological education, training church leaders and advocating for the end to gender based violence across the world.

abby mohaupt earned the nomination for her leadership as moderator of Fossil Free PCUSA (FFPCUSA), an advocacy organization working to end the denomination's relationship with both fossil fuels and the harmful effects of capitalism. She organized a walk from Louisville, Kentucky, to St. Louis, Missouri, ahead of 223rd General Assembly (2018), which both raised awareness and helped build connections with communities most impacted by climate change.

Tamara Williams' work as Stated Clerk of the Presbytery of Charlotte prompted Jan Edmiston (past co-moderator of the General Assembly) to nominate Tamara. Calling Tamara "a regional and national treasure in the PC(USA)," Jan praised Tamara's "personal integrity, her historical knowledge, her calm counsel, her ability to connect with every kind of person." She is beloved by her congregation, co-members of committees, mid council leaders, the Presbyterian Mission Agency, and the Association of Stated Clerks.

On behalf of RE&WIM and Presbyterian Women, we celebrate these great leaders by honoring them with this award. We also honor all the women leading movements for positive change within and beyond the church.

matter of careful ethical decision of the patient . . . and therefore should not be restricted by law" (Minutes of the 182nd General Assembly (1970), United Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., p. 891). During the 220th General Assembly (2012), the PC(USA) affirmed, "no law should impose criminal penalties against any [person] who chooses or physician who performs a medically safe abortion . . . and no law should sanction any action intended to harm or harass those persons contemplating or deciding to have an abortion" (Minutes, Journal, p. 1698–1699).

Presbyterian Women, Inc., affirms the standing of the PC(USA), the June 24, 2022, statements of the Office of Public Witness and the PC(USA) Stated Clerk, and the June 23–25, 2022, work of the General Assembly Committee on Health Issues, and encourages Presbyterian women to

- Support full access to reproductive health care (GA Minutes, Journal, 2012, p. 1698).
- "Protect the integrity of individual conscience by affirming the ability of women and men to make . . . decisions in matters of reproductive health, including decisions about infertility, parenthood, and responses to problem pregnancies, in consultation with their families, pastors, health-care professionals, and scientifically accurate medical information" (GA Minutes, 2012, p. 1699).
- Know the facts about reproductive justice and share the information.
- Donate to local health clinics.
- Accompany and support people who need reproductive health care.
- In states where there are no reproductive health options, work with others in the community to provide transportation, housing and other needs.
- Ask your churches to speak up regarding gender equity, reproductive justice and the PC(USA) position.
- Support pro-reproductive health candidates.
- Pray to God and pray in public with your faithful actions.*

Looking for PW's Future Leaders

The search for Presbyterian Women Churchwide's future leaders is on!

Nominations are being accepted for individuals who will serve during the 2024–2027 triennium in the following positions:

- Moderator
- Vice Moderator
- Finance Committee Chair
- Search Committee Moderator
- Five Regional Search Committee Members
- Six Members-at-large: African American, Asian American, Hispanic/Latin American, Korean American, Middle Eastern American, Native American
- Two Young Women Representatives-at-large (under the age of 35)

With the exception of the five regional search committee members, these leaders will serve on PW Inc.'s Board. This body makes decisions for PW at the churchwide level, in addition to responding to the needs of the organization as a whole. In addition to supporting the PW Purpose and working well as team players, the following are general expectations for all Board members.

- Must be a member of a Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) congregation or a clergy member of a PC(USA) presbytery.
- Check email at least every two days and expect two or more video conference calls between Board meetings.
- Attend in-person Board meetings and participate in Board video conference meetings, both as scheduled. Meetings may convene on weekdays and weekends. Meeting and travel expenses will be covered for in-person meetings.
- Be assigned to a committee which meets during Board meetings. Additional committee assignments may include committees which meet in person or video conference between Board meetings.

Some leadership positions have additional requirements. Visit presbyterianwomen.org/search for more information.

Nominations for the Young Women Representatives-at-large should be sent to the Search Committee Moderator; all other nominations should be sent to the Search Representative in your region. Nominations are due December 15, 2022.

At the churchwide level, Presbyterian Women supports Matthew 25, a denominational commitment to see, to serve and to act with compassion and boldness. PW is deepening our engagement with the Disparities Experienced by Black Women and Girls Task Force and continues to work towards dismantling racism as an actively antiracist organization. PW, through ecumenical engagement, addresses food insecurity through Bread for the World, builds community through participation in the International Fellowship of the Least Coin and World Day of Prayer, and through the Poor People's Campaign, amplifies the voices of people shackled by economic distress in unjust systems.

Even during fallow times, our committed grassroots networks provide and advocate for God's people. See for yourself! Consider Cherie Murchie's 2021 snapshot of PW ministries in Seattle Presbytery. Then multiply all that the Seattle PWs did in a "fallow" year by the more-than-150 presbyteries with active PWs. Thank you, PW!

Cherie says, "During the 2021 calendar year with Covid-19 mitigations Presbyterian Women throughout the Seattle Presbytery have been very creative in supporting local mission in their communities and beyond. Calvary Presbyterian Church collected toys, crafts, games and gift cards for Christmas giving to the Plateau Kids Network Holiday Helping Hands. Food donations were gathered and given to the Neighbors in Need weekend backpack program for families in the Enumclaw, Washington, School District. Women at Newport Presbyterian knitted scarves and hats, grew vegetables for the food bank, held a warm clothing drive, provided meals for the Sophia Way shelter in Bellevue, and continue to support the Women's Society of Guatemala sewing guild, SacB'e Co-operative, and families in their native villages. Overlark Park Presbyterian Women made handcrafts and held three mini-craft fairs supporting Afghan refugees in the Puget Sound region, Price Ministries that refashions clothing for missionaries, meals for the Salvation Army, and donations to Presbyterian Disaster Relief for Haiti and mid-west tornadoes.

Drawing on the deep well of hope and joy during a lingering pandemic, Presbyterian Women chose community by logging in to the **2021 Churchwide Business Meeting and Online Gathering Event**. PW's voting representatives and leadership embraced new (mostly virtual) ways to do the important work of PW, and many PW came together to celebrate a new triennium in Christ's service as Presbyterian women. More than 3,000 individuals tuned in via YouTube to watch PW's Business Meeting and more Trusting that seeds sown even in hard seasons and conditions are necessary for later bounty, Presbyterian Women lovingly cast seeds and tended growing ministries throughout 2021. With confidence in our PW ministry, together we serve, care, advocate and grow in faith and hope.

Being loved by our Gardener, we cultivate PW. Put another way, being loved by God, we love through action and prayer through our PW Purpose.

than 4,500 for the Gathering plenary and worship. But only the One who knows each sparrow and strand of hair (Lk. 12:6–7) knows the exact number of PW who came together during these two days as many PW groups held watch parties.

Deepening our study of scripture

To further the commitment "to nurture our faith through prayer and Bible study," PW publishes a fully PW-chosen and -field-tested study each year. In early 2021, PW Synod moderators helped form a national PW Bible study during the season of Lent. Female clergy led the group study of the 2020–2021 PW/*Horizons* study, *Into the Light Finding Hope through Prayers of Lament*, by P. Lynn Miller, a study whose timely theme was chosen years in advance of the pandemic. With experience of an online study, participants can now plant or join a virtual Bible study with their PW in the synod, presbytery or congregation!

Supporting mission

In a year of infrequent in-person meetings, Presbyterian Women still managed to grant nearly \$700,000 to programs and ministries through our Birthday and Thank Offerings. Anne Schneider of PW's Mission Relationships Committee sums it up best: "Mission efforts bind us together as Christians and offer a glimmer of light in what has been a pretty dim world [during 2021]. It's the principal way I express through action my love for God and for my neighbors, known and unknown." Advocating for Justice and Peace

Justice for women and girls roots PW advocacy and justice efforts. Presbyterian Women began attending United Nations' Commission on the Status of Women (UN CSW) more than 17 years ago and has since earned NGO (non-governmental organization) status at the UN. In 2021, PW delegates participated in CSW65, the first CSW to be held completely online, engaging the theme, "Women in public life, equal participation in decision-making." The theme recognizes that although women shoulder much of the child-rearing and household work, they also shoulder much of the work on the frontlines in terms of caring for their communities through health care, childcare, education, and other essential work. Having an equal say-so over their lives and work is foundational to transforming their lives and our world.

In 2021, Presbyterian Women, through our historic Birthday Offering, granted \$77,061 to **Memorial Drive Ministries (MDM)** in Stone Mountain, Georgia. More than 50,000 refugees have been welcomed to the Stone Mountain–Clarkson area, dubbed the most diverse square mile in North America. MDM is a church-based nonprofit that ministers to their changing community by providing a welcoming environment for programs that need space to thrive and grow. PW's grant provided necessary capital improvements to the MDM gymnasium. Now, two of the many collaborations and community organizations that use the gym are the Paideia School's Ultimate Frisbee Team and Inspire Shalom afterschool program. Our financial gift will bless, year after year, in beautiful ways that we cannot know today. "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1). Indeed.

MDM's Executive Director David Roth says,

"The Paideia School's Ultimate Frisbee Team utilizes the gym for team practices and coaching students from the Inspire Shalom afterschool program, which serves resettled refugee middle-schoolers. In 2017, the new partners were looking for a regular practice space that would not be affected by weather, but it has become so much more. The space allows sharing a love for ultimate frisbee but also for building incredible friendships. Athletes look forward to the time in the gym for competitive and fun practices. Girls love coaching and making lasting relationships with the students of Inspire, gaining valuable experience as leaders, coaches and near-peer mentors. They are so grateful to have a gym like this nearby so this magic can happen every Wednesday, January to June. Thank you for investing in our campus and our community!"

Seeds planted today—thanks, in part, to Presbyterian Women's generous support of the Birthday Offering—provide precious youth a harvest of friendship, learning, and a big dollop of fun!

Presbyterian Women supports mission through several giving streams.
