The Birthday Offering of Presbyterian Women was born in 1922 when Hallie Paxson Winsborough challenged each member of the Woman's Auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church in the United States to give a penny for each year of her life as a "birthday gift" to celebrate the tenth anniversary of the organization. 

Making Miracles Group Home (MMGH) helps young mothers break the cycle of abusive relationships, addiction, incarceration and early motherhood—a repeating pattern that is difficult to break and overcome. Since its inception in 2010, MMGH has served over 100 women and their children by providing a one-year, live-in program designed to support young mothers and help them develop skills to live independently and care for their children.

Current eligibility criteria require residents to be pregnant and/or have a single child up to age three, but mothers who have a single child older than age three or multiple children often seek help. With the Birthday Offering grant, MMGH will purchase a second group home to serve an additional five families who are at risk of experiencing homelessness. With loving support and tools to establish stable, permanent housing, these families can look forward to a hopeful and successful future.





Berhane Yesus Elementary School

Kindergarten School Construction

Berhane Yesus Elementary School, located in the western highlands of Ethiopia, seeks to change lives by sharing the "Light of Jesus" and by providing the best possible educational experience for the children of Dembi Dollo. Berhane Yesus provides children with the possibility of a better future by preparing them for a rigorous high school education and a life of Christian service. The school is the first entry point to education for children of subsistence farmers, migrant workers and displaced groups of people.

This K-8th grade school has been serving the community and been a part of the Presbyterian Church in this rural community since 1921. A kindergarten was added to the school in 2012, but with no available space for class, the children met in the chapel. Over the years the number of kindergarten students has increased and now space of their own is not only needed but is required by the government to remain open. Western Wollega Bethel Synod provided land for the classroom and the Birthday Offering grant will provide all necessary funding for its construction.

Meditation

StoryPeople, a family-run art and gift company, creates whimsical little prints with short sayings that capture our shared humanity and our collective call to live and live well. Based out of Iowa, StoryPeople "spends [their] days making art and thinking about things like whether it is worth the extra effort to toast the bread before you make a sandwich, or the true meaning of flowers or what the world would be like if everyone tried a bit harder to be nice to each other." 1

Some of their prints are quite silly, bringing a laugh to the surface, and others offer comfort or gratitude.

I'm drawn to the prints that speak of hope, "Packets of Light" being one of them. It reads, "These are little packets of light and you need to plant them early in the year and remember to mark where they were because lots of times they look like weeds in the beginning and it's not until later that you see how beautiful they really are." This particular print reminds me of Paul's encouragement to the churches in Galatia—not only because of the imagery of planting, reaping and sowing, but because of its hopeful orientation toward the future.

So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith (Galatians 6:9–10).

In these verses, we see a correlation between what one sows and what one harvests. The gardeners and farmers among us know this well, as do those of us who benefit from the seasonal flavors of harvest—sweet summer strawberries and ripe heirloom tomatoes. The use of an agricultural

have resonated with folks in antiquity, just as it resonates with us today. Verses 9 and 10 come on the heels of a message (Galatians 6:1-10) that has been titled in the NRSV as "Bear One Another's Burdens," in the NIV as "Doing Good to All," and in the CEB as "Caring and Sharing." Thus, it is in the larger pericope that we hear what it is, exactly, that we ought to persevere in—what we ought to not grow weary in. In other words, we hear what our responsibilities are. This brings out the second and fourth grade teacher in me. At the beginning of every school year, my students, co-teacher and I used to sit down together to create a "Class Covenant." This often included statements like, "Be kind. Do my best and ask for help when I need to. Be safe and look out for the safety of others. Respect other people, places and things. Have fun." It was a list of responsibilities that, as teachers, we hoped would contribute to establishing a community of trust and belonging, safety and growth.

While perhaps not quite so elementary, Paul also writes of responsibilities that he hopes will contribute to establishing a community of trust and belonging, safety and growth among the churches in Galatia. The responsibility is this: bear burdens, embody a spirit of gentleness, be wary of spiritual pride. All this, Paul writes, for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith.

The call is not to persevere with the intention of reaping harvest for self, despite all natural inclinations to do so. The call is to persevere for the good of all, to look beyond self, to see another, and to recognize our home together in the family of faith.

Through the PW Birthday Offering, we receive and act upon this charge year after year by supporting communities near and far—communities who are also receiving and acting upon this charge through creative offerings of service to their own communities. This offering, in many ways, is a little packet of light. We plant early in the year, with love and hope and prayer, trusting that with God's help we will later say, "how beautiful." May it be so.

Prayer of Dedication

Gardener God, you sow new seeds each day, tenderly planting little packets of light that, by your grace, will one day be harvested. Today we pray for your nourishing hand over this year's Birthday Offering, which will support children of the community in Dembi Dollo, Ethiopia, and mothers and children in Tallahassee, Florida. We know, Gardener God, the importance of stable community—the essential ingredient in

the soil around us that allows for flourishing. May the gifts we bring to you and share through this year's Birthday Offering contribute to the nourishing and flourishing of your beloved children. Amen.

IDEAS TO CELEBRATE THE BIRTHDAY OFFERING

- 1 Host a "throwback" birthday party with cake, decorations, music and costumes from each decade starting with the 1920s.
- Give a presentation about the beginnings of the Birthday Offering and its recipients over the years or hold a trivia contest with questions about Presbyterian Women, the Birthday Offering and important women in your community. Catherine Stewart Vaughn's book, Messages of Hope and Reconciliation: 75 Years of the Birthday Offering (1922–1997), brims with interesting details and is now on sale through the PW Shop for \$3! - 3 Set out twelve birthday baskets with a different theme for each month and invite people to "vote" for their favorite with their dollars. See which month collects the most for the offering!
- 4 Use the Birthday Offering bulletin cover and insert in your church's worship service. Collect the offering in boxes covered in birthday gift wrap.
- 5 Host a meal and ask each table hostess to decorate her table. Have a contest for the winning table!
- 6 Challenge everyone in your church to make a gift to the offering, telling the story of Ms. Winsborough's encouragement for women to give a penny for each year of her life as a "birthday gift" for mission in 1922.
- 7 Throw a churchwide birthday party. Decorate tables for 12 months of the year and list everyone's birthday that falls in in each month.
- S Illustrate the Birthday Offering's worldwide reach by placing tacks or stickers on a map to show grant recipients over the years. Use as a paper display or as a slide in an online presentation. Find the list at <u>presbyterianwomen.org/downloads/birthday-offering-years</u>.

- 9 Host a rummage sale, with proceeds benefitting the Birthday Offering.

- 11 Drop off a cupcake and Birthday Offering materials to the homes of Presbyterian women who cannot attend in-person events.


