/ach year faithful givers demonstrate their thankfulness to God through giving to the Thank Offering of Presbyterian Women. This program began in 1888 when Eliza Clokey of Springfield, Ohio, urged each woman to give one dollar over and above her usual contribution to the Women's General Missionary Society of the United Presbyterian Church of North America. A century later, the newly formed Presbyterian Women in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) adopted the Thank Offering as one of the two grant making programs of the national organization. Since then, more than 1,600 different projects in the United States and around the world have benefitted from the generosity of thousands of Presbyterian women through an offering that originated with the vision and leadership of one thankful woman.

It has been 135 years since Eliza first called upon women to give a "thank offering to her Lord" and support mission initiatives at home and abroad. Today Presbyterian Women celebrates that we are bound by history to the legacy of Eliza and bound by the love of Christ to one another. By giving to the Thank Offering, we connect to the women who came before us, demonstrate our gratitude to God, and make real our care for one another.

In 2023 the Creative Ministries Offering Committee of Presbyterian Women reviewed twenty-eight Thank Offering applications and selected seven projects for funding. Six of the projects serve people in the United States and one is international. In keeping with the Thank Offering bylaws, more than forty percent of the selected projects are related to health ministries.

### SYNOD OF MID-AMERICA

Presbytery of Giddings-Lovejoy Light for the Darkness New Worshipping Community Grounded Gardening \$10,000 light4thedarkness.com

Grounded Gardening hosts a worshipful support group for people with mental health variances. Young adults are invited to come as they are, meet God through Creation and use gardening to combat depression and anxiety. The program combines a variety of activities that have been shown to improve mental health including social connection, prayer, exercise, gardening and time outdoors. This multifaceted approach is intended to help improve mood while also encouraging a connection to God and to each other. The grant will support gardening supplies, advertising and stipends for lead gardeners and facilitators who also guide meditation.

Created in 2020, the Summer Arts Camp meets a crucial community need for quality childcare and a supportive summer learning environment in Wilmington, Delaware. The program—a collaboration between Presbyterian Church of the Covenant and The Music School of Delaware—offers a safe, tuition-free summer camp that introduces children from households that struggle financially to valuable arts experiences. This innovative approach helps children who have experienced trauma to heal through music, art, dance, singing and drama. With the Thank Offering grant, the camp will offer a new full-day option and expand their capacity to accept fifty children. Through this arts-focused camp, children



will explore and develop creativity skills, build confidence and find healing through artistic expression.



Peace River Presbytery Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance, Inc. First Neighborhood Building \$50,000 immokaleefairhousing.org

Immokalee Fair Housing Alliance began in December 2018, following the destruction of Hurricane Irma that spotlighted the terrible living conditions of low-income families. This project will provide safe and affordable housing for agricultural workers and other families who pay up to seventy percent of their income to reside in dilapidated and crowded trailers. The Thank Offering grant will support the first neighborhood building consisting of sixteen apartments. These units will provide families with long term stability in clean, adequate housing that will improve family life and provide children with a healthy foundation so that they can study and learn.

### SYNOD OF SOUTH ATLANTIC

Presbytery of St. Augustine Gainesville Community Counseling Center, Inc. Building Resilience Through Mindfulness \$50,000 gainesvillecounselingcenter.com

National surveys show that LGBTQIA+ youth are more likely to experiment with drugs and alcohol, experience harassment and bullying at school and suffer from mental health issues. By providing mental health support, community education and camping, this program will address the challenges facing LGBTQIA+ youth who have had little access to these services. The counseling center will offer mental healthcare through individual, group and family therapy that highlights mindfulness as an effective tool for managing many mental health conditions. Workshops and podcasts will be offered to help increase awareness in the general public and expand the network of community support.

TAUM provides a safe space in an underserved and low-income area of Albany with few youth programs. Through Tech for Teens, an expansion of their Computers for Kids Summer Program, students will learn to use Microsoft Office to write resumes, prepare spreadsheets and create slide presentations while also acquiring basic web design and coding skills. Through this hands-on learning, students will increase literacy, build student collaboration skills as they work together on projects and develop important social skills that employers will seek in the future.

### SYNOD OF THE SUN

Presbytery of South Louisiana Okra Abbey New Worshipping Community Solar Power for Resilience \$35,000 okraabbey.com

Okra Abbey is a female-led, communityfocused ministry for residents of the Pigeon Town neighborhood in New Orleans. Their sanctuary is a garden where food grows and where people grow through sharing stories, scripture, prayers and relationships. The Thank Offering will provide a full solar power system and allow Okra Abbey to expand their services by having available outlets for power tools, an irrigation system and cell phone charging stations for low-income and often transitory individuals. The solar power system will also keep the community refrigerator running and provide reliable electricity during power outages, especially during weather disasters.

This project will provide rural residents of Phalaza with access to a health-care facility closer than their current centers, which also do not provide maternity services. Because of the distances people must travel, they frequently delay care, one of the primary causes for mortality and morbidity in women and children. This new health center will provide maternal services including prenatal, delivery, and postnatal care, as well as primary care of children and diagnosis and treatment of malaria and HIV/AIDS, as well as non-communicable diseases like diabetes and high blood pressure. The new health center will have the added benefit of relieving overcrowding and long wait times throughout rural eastern Zambia.

Meditation

Have you had the experience of reaching out to hold a toddler's hand as you walked in the park, or tried to help a child put on a shirt or pour milk into their favorite cup? I remember well the times when my grandmotherly gestures of loving concern were met with "I wanna run!" or "I can do it all by myself!" Often, I would grant my grandson his freedom and allow him to struggle into a shirt or spill milk on the countertop. Those were memories of the growing out of babyhood dependency days and into a bigger-boy phase of building confidence and self-reliance. That is, until the time came when he faced a more daunting task and I would hear a tiny voice asking, "Granmommy, can you help me?"

Like a child, we too have found ourselves crying "Lord, help me!" when met with life's difficulties. God's call to demonstrate a love that unites is not as easy as one might think. As scripture tells us, God's original plan for wholeness and peace throughout Creation was thwarted by human strife, unrest and war. Many of us have experienced having our own well-intentioned words and actions met with suspicion and rejection. Yet we persevere in faith, trying to live

out God's call for unifying love, even when the world is so unloving. It is during times like these that we find ourselves whispering in prayer, "Lord, God of mercy, please help us, your children."
