Sue Rheem, PC(USA) representative to the United Nations, shares about the importance of belonging in PW's upcoming book, *Etchings in Diversity: Book* 2. Born in South Korea, Sue was raised by white Canadian parents. She says her life can be demarcated in three segments: "The time in Korea as a young child, the time in Canada as a teenager, and then the time in the U.S. as I began my adult life going to college and beyond." Sue has grappled with finding "home" but over time realized that belonging is what matters. "Having a sense of place matters less. For what I was looking for was belonging. I have come to realize that I belong and have my identity. I do not feel alone. The kinship that is greater than ourselves holds us together" (p. 61).

PW Gives Day commemorates the founding of "today's" Presbyterian Women. But for generations (before us and ahead of us), PW provides a place of welcome, of belonging, for women united in a shared faith as given expression in our PW Purpose.

Etchings in Diversity



Storytelling opens hearts and minds. In 1999, Presbyterian Women released *Etchings in Diversity*, which provided a space for women to share their stories as individuals and as Presbyterian Women, and has remained in print since its publication. Twenty-four years later, more women have shared their stories in *Etchings in Diversity: Book 2*, which will debut at the 2024 Churchwide Gathering of

Presbyterian Women (for purchase in the Presbyterian Bookstore) and through the PW Shop (presbyterianwomen.org/shop; 800/533-4371) as a print item (PWR24209, \$7.00) and PDF download (PWR24210, \$7.00). In this second volume, seventeen Presbyterian women share their unique life stories and shared faith. (Questions for reflection and conversation are included.)
