Ten years ago, First Presbyterian Church in Jeffersonville, Indiana, and the Nyanza Area Africa Inland Church formed a partnership to build a tree nursery in Kenya. Tens of thousands of trees have since literally sprouted, taking root in schoolyards and churchyards, urban landscapes and farmlands. And figuratively, church leaders have planted seeds among parishioners and neighbors as they expand a ministry called God's Green Resourceful Earth.

In 2024, a new idea took root. Thousands of schoolchildren were going hungry. Why not feed them all while nurturing their love of nature and skill in gardening? A pilot program called "Growing Gardens, Feeding Minds" opened at Renja Primary School, feeding daily nutritious lunches, prepared with produce from the garden and locally sourced foods, to 650 students.

Renja's principal, Madame Mary Amonde, pointed out that daily lunches help children to stay in school to learn. For children who are HIV positive, she emphasized, the food is life-saving medicine. Within a few months, Renja students' well-being was documented by significant increases in standardized test scores.

The Presbyterian Women's Thank Offering grant will help this project flourish and expand. Through your giving you help grow gardens and feed minds, bodies and communities.
