After the flood of 2016, First Presbyterian Church of Hammond, Louisiana, installed two showers for Presbyterian Disaster Assistance volunteer teams who were housed on the campus. The showers were well used over the next few years and occasionally were offered to displaced families. But most of the time they sat empty. In 2024 the church began utilizing the showers by serving the homeless community. Each Friday morning, warm showers, fresh clothes, food and fellowship are made available to those who otherwise have no access to showers. At first just two or three guests showed up along with four or five volunteers. Now the ministry has up to 20 volunteers serving about 20 guests. By partnering with other congregations and local businesses, support has arrived from many who were previously unfamiliar with the church.

Two of the original shower guests now serve as volunteers along with church and community members. Additionally, volunteers now champion for those experiencing homelessness and are at the forefront of those who are advocating for a proposed homeless shelter in the community.
