Meditation
This year's Thank Offering scripture highlights how God brings hope and renewal to the people, even in the midst of seemingly impossible situations. Following the fall of Jerusalem and the destruction of the temple in 587 (BCE), the people of Israel were forced into exile in Babylon. In this verse from Isaiah, we encounter the prophet as he paints a hopeful and joyous picture of returning to the land of Israel. To this new generation returning home after five decades in a foreign land, Isaiah says that a "new and improved" exodus is promised by God for the people.

Presbyterian women's gifts to the Thank Offering also offer hope and renewal. Our grant recipients have a plan, and work to improve the lives of those they serve—the "least of these" (Matt. 25:45). PW's Thank Offering grants enable and empower them to do just that.

A variety of ministries that serve the needs of our siblings in Christ will receive grants this year with gifts received through the Thank Offering. Beds will be built for children in Nebraska, and tiny home duplexes will be constructed in Washington. Buckhorn Children and Family Services will put up fencing to keep children safe in Kentucky, and Community Garden Kitchen will create a restaurant training program for foster care youth in Texas. In New York, grants will fund technology upgrades in Queens and a kitchen renovation in Spencertown. The Thank Offering will help feed people in Virginia and provide showers for those who need them in Louisiana. Leadership training will be possible for youth and adults in Sheridan, Wyoming, and across the country in Roanoke, Virginia.

All these gifts will improve the lives of those receiving them. Your generosity to the Thank Offering bears witness to God's work in the world.
